Our mission here at OCS is to equip students to fulfill their unique God-given purpose. This growth looks like a parking lot, but it is so much more. It is a gateway to community as we bring events like Grandparents' Day, all school chapels, sporting events and more onto campus. It is the first step in the future expansion of facilities and programs for our students. It is the next chapter in building the legacy and future of OCS.

And while the future is bright, I continue to find wisdom in our past.

Last fall, I was at a dinner with a group of our founding teachers and administrators. I listened as they talked about the good times and the tough times, about blessings and about struggles like skipping a paycheck, sewing athletic uniforms by hand, or teaching a class they had never taught before. During our conversation, there were two questions asked that I've remembered all year.

The first question asked was, "Why...why go through all of that?" Their response was immediate, "We did it for the students, of course."

And the second question I remember was, "How?" "How did you survive?" The answer was simple, "We survived on prayer. We took everything to God in prayer."

As we celebrate our '23-'24 school year, and look ahead to '24-'25, may we also be known as a community who says, "We take everything to God in prayer."

HISTORY OF OCS

It's been more than 50 years since a dedicated group of parents established Oakland Christian School. Since the first 51 students in grades 7-12 gathered at Oakland Avenue Presbyterian Church in 1968, there have been many changes both at Oakland Christian School and in the world of education.

Through the years, Oakland Christian School has continued to grow and flourish. After several temporary church locations, in September 1976, prayers were answered when 50 acres of land were donated for a new facility on Shimmons Road in Auburn Hills. On October 15, 1977, 383 students and faculty began classes in the new spacious school. As enrollment continued to climb, five modular classrooms were purchased between 1980-86, and an office complex was connected to the main building at the beginning of the 1986-87 school year.

During the mid-nineties, plans for the addition to the existing structure were initiated. In 1996, the board implemented a capital campaign to raise money for additional classrooms, a media center, and a multi-purpose facility. The new structure also allowed for a cafeteria addition, kindergarten classes to return to the main campus, and removal of the modular classrooms.

Now, as we once again consider our strategic and visionary plan for future growth, we are guided by our mission to equip our students for His purpose, and our vision to see them leave our doors and impact their communities for His Kingdom. To this end, an OCS planning committee, members of the school board, and administration have been working for several months, considering all of the requirements and options.

We are blessed to have the space to expand the existing facilities on our school grounds, and with the purchase of the land across the street in the front of our building, we have the opportunity to move forward with the first step in our vision – expanding parking space. Auburn Hills reconfigured Shimmons road this summer, giving us space to add over an additional 100 parking spaces to the front of our building, alleviating the congestion of drop-off and pick-up times, providing ample parking for large school events, and the ability to welcome more families to our campus.

As we move ahead with the plans before us, we rejoice in how the Lord continues to provide in and through this institution. Our location and buildings are a testimony to His faithfulness and His blessings on the sacrifice and efforts of dedicated parents, staff and administration throughout the years. We are immensely grateful for the solid foundation they have provided, and we look forward with great anticipation to God's blessing on the growth that is yet to come.

PARKING LOT EXPANSION PROJECT




The new road configuration and the plan for the addition of over 100 parking spaces will provide:

- Improved traffic flow for drop-off and pickup
- A turn lane for entering the OCS parking lot
- Separate entrances for elementary and secondary
- Necessary parking for our larger, oncampus events
- Increased safety for our entire community


In the summer of 2024 OCS and the City of Auburn Hills initiated a construction project that will facilitate a much-needed parking expansion on the OCS campus. The city of Auburn Hills reconfigured Shimmons Road, allowing the majority of land previously "across the street" to now be accessed without crossing the street, making it the ideal location to expand parking.

As excitement grew for our vision to expand the OCS campus, so did our support! Throughout the year, the entire OCS community - parents, alumni, grandparents, faculty, students and friends - generously contributed! As a result, over \$400,000 has been raised to date as we continue to bring in funding for this project!




OCS ANNUAL FUND

In 2023 we launched the first ever OCS Annual Fund with a theme centered on celebrating 55 years of "Equipping Together." We set a goal of \$150,000 to be used to support our faculty & staff, our academic & athletic programming and additional funding for tuition assistance.
